Encourage Systems Thinking

Highlight connections between environmental, social, economic, technological, and governance dimensions.

Presentation Guidelines

Presentation Length

- 10–15 minutes per speaker
- Timing may vary depending on the number of speakers

Recommended Slide Count

- 10–15 slides maximum
- Focus on quality over quantity

Recommended Structure

1. Introduction

2. Key challenge or opportunity
 3. Framework, model, or approach
 4. Case study or practical example
 5. Lessons learned
 6. Recommendations for fellows
 7. Closing insight
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Designing a High-Impact Presentation

The most effective presentations include:

- ✓ Real-world examples
- ✓ Visuals rather than text-heavy slides
- ✓ Actionable recommendations
- ✓ Practical tools and frameworks
- ✓ Stories that demonstrate measurable impact

Avoid

- Reading directly from slides
 - Excessive technical jargon
 - Dense text
 - Overly promotional content
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Coordination with Fellow Speakers

Each module is intentionally designed to bring together diverse perspectives.

We encourage speakers to:

- Review fellow speakers' presentations when available
- Identify complementary themes
- Avoid unnecessary duplication
- Build upon ideas introduced earlier in the session

This helps create a more cohesive and valuable learning experience.
